Item 4 – The delinquent accounts and pending suits for collection will be reviewed at the May meeting.

Item 5 – Craig Hlavinka gave a report on the activity at the Port of Bay City Turning Basin. There is nothing out of the ordinary. Roehm Americas LLC has vacated the Port property. The ramp and porch to the new office building have been completed. Zachary Phillips Inc will be pouring the concrete for the for the handicap parking spot.

Craig Hlavinka gave a report on the activity at Matagorda Harbor. Everything is running smoothly. All the metal pilings have been painted.

Item 6 – Glenn Escovedo, with LPL Financial, updated the Commissioners on the current investment portfolio. The account has appreciated approximately \$800,000 since November 2024. The current duration is 3.22 years which has increased from 2.80 years as some bonds have extended. Inflation has been stubborn. When reinvesting, LPL looks at bonds that will keep the invested funds protected. Higher coupon bonds are being invested in. The GNMAs are averaging five to seven years in duration. George Harrison advised that the Port Authority has four to five million dollars at Prosperity Bank invested in an on-demand fund with brings the average duration to below three years. Every three months there is approximately \$300,000 to \$400,000 to reinvest. The Port portfolio target GNMAs as they are a direct governmental obligation and treasuries. The cash flow is taken into consideration when

investing. George Harrison asked Norton Rose Fulbright if there were any questions or comments. There were none. The Commissioners had no comments.

Item 7 – Alyssa Dibbern, with Matagorda Bay Foundation, discussed the letter of support being requested for the East Matagorda Bay Wetland Habitat Restoration and Flood Resilience Study. Bill Balboa sent a draft letter of support to Sharron Perez. Matagorda Bay Foundation is working through the NOAA Grant to bring fresh water to the bay and assist in flood protection. On motion of Commissioner Trey Treybig, seconded by Commissioner Matthew Ashcraft, the Commissioners unanimously approved a letter of support for the East Matagorda Bay Wetland Habitat Restoration and Flood Resilience Grant.

Item 9 – Luke Cressman, with HDR Engineering Inc, updated the Commissioners on the Port of Bay City Turning Basin West Basin Bulkhead Improvements. There was an issue with the geo-reference overlay regarding the wetland impact. Luke Cressman is reviewing and will send the NEPA draft tomorrow. NEPA is critical to complete first; therefore, the engineering and permit drawings are still in process. The current scope of work covers the preliminary design. A proposal when be submitted for the final design plan. George Harrison asked if the error on the geo-reference is greater than 0.1 acres. Luke Cressman advised that when the plans were overlayed on the site there was a small issue that has be3en corrected now. If the proposal can be issued in May, there would be enough time to complete the process between the May and June meetings.

Item 10 - Luke Cressman, with HDR Engineering Inc, updated the Commissioners on the dredging of Caney Creek. The project has been put out for bid. There is a pre-bid meeting tomorrow. Four companies have met with the US Army Corps of Engineers regarding the placement area 100 that is being utilized for the project to coordinate efforts. There is no US Army Corps of Engineers has no activity planned after September. The projected timeline for dredging should be October or November.

Items 10 -12 – The Port-property Approved Jurisdictional Determination Project, Matagorda Harbor Maintenance Dredging Project, and Colorado River Diversion Channel and Parker's Cut Phase project updates were not discussed due to Ian Fisher, with Anchor QEA, not being available. On motion of Commissioner Joey Sliva, seconded by Commissioner Matthew Ashcraft, the Commissioners unanimously tabled all three items.

Item 13 – Leslie Bacon, with Norton Rose Fulbright, advised that all matters have been covered.

Item 14 — Michael Ferdinand, Matagorda County Economic Development Executive Director, updated the Commissioners on various projects in Matagorda County. Matagorda Day in Austin was a success. Positive meetings were held with Texas General Land Office, film commission, and the governor's economic development committee. They are monitoring current legislation regarding tax abatement and other tax incentives for industrial development. The legislation could affect the competitiveness of the County to attract businesses. There has been a decline in project requests resulting from the potential tariffs. The requests are now starting to appear as companies are looking for sites driven by tariffs. The rail project is still moving forward. George Harrison thanked Mike Ferdinand for his service and work towards economic development. Joey Sliva asked about the rail project for Lyondell. Mike Ferdinand advised the rail company is still discussing with landowners, but there is no definite timeline. George Harrison asked if eminent domain could be utilized. The rail company is not wanting to utilize eminent domain but have advised the landowners of their rights from the beginning.

Item 15 – Joey Sliva asked when Tenaris's ten-year tax abatement will end. The abatement given by the Port Authority will end with the 2025 taxes which are paid in 2026.

There were no other public or Commissioner Comments at this time.

Item 18 – There being no other business to come before the board, on motion of Commissioner Matthew Ashcraft, seconded by Commissioner Lee Weathers, the Commissioners unanimously adjourned the meeting at 7:00pm.
